Gingerbread Pancakes

ANIMAL WASTE OPERATORS

#### Ingredients:

- 2 eggs
- <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> cup molasses
- 2 cups buttermilk
- 2 cups white whole-wheat flour
- <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> tablespoon baking powder
- <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> teaspoon baking soda
- <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> teaspoon salt
- 1 teaspoon ground ginger
- 1 teaspoon cinnamon
- <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> teaspoon nutmeg
- 1/4 teaspoon allspice
- Maple syrup for serving

#### Instructions:

1. In a large mixing bowl, add



- 2. In a medium mixing bowl, mix together flour, baking powder, baking soda, salt, ginger, cinnamon, nutmeg and allspice until combined.
- 3. Slowly add dry mixture to the wet, whisking just until mixtures are combined.
- 4. Heat butter on a large skillet over medium-low heat.
- 5. Add <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> cup of pancake mixture to the skillet, leaving space in between pancakes. Cook for 3-5 minutes, or until air bubbles begin to form on the surface. Flip over and cook for another 3-5 minutes, until browned.
- 6. Serve with maple syrup
