Salted Dark Chocolate with Pomegranate and Almonds



INGREDIENTS:

*8 ounce dark chocolate (at least 72% cacao), chopped

*1/4 cup chopped almonds, toasted *1/4 cup unsweetened large coconut flakes, toasted *1/4 cup pomographic coode

*1/4 cup pomegranate seeds

*Pinch flaked sea salt

INSTRUCTIONS:

 Line 15×10-inch baking sheet with parchment paper; set aside.
Place chocolate in a medium heatproof bowl set over (not in) a saucepan of gently simmering water. Stir chocolate occasionally just until melted, 4 to 5 minutes. Spread chocolate evenly in a thin layer on the prepared baking sheet.

3. Sprinkle with almonds, coconut and pomegranate seeds and sea salt, pressing gently into the chocolate. Refrigerate 20 minutes or until set. Store covered in the refrigerator for up to 2 days.
