- Youth will be dropped off and picked up for **ALL** camps at 444 Bristol Drive, Statesville NC 28677
- Field trip return times can vary due to traffic and weather conditions. We will attempt to notify those picking up the children if the return time changes by more than 15 minutes.
- Children should arrive and be picked up **ON TIME** at the end of scheduled workshops and after returning from a field trip.
- **WORKSHOP PARTICIPANTS** under the age of 8 or below 80 pounds in weight will be required to provide a child safety restraint seat when attending field trips.
- **NO FLIP-FLOPS, opened toed shoes, or sandals allowed for any activity!**
- ***If youth arrive in inappropriate footwear, they cannot join the workshop until they obtain appropriate footwear.***
